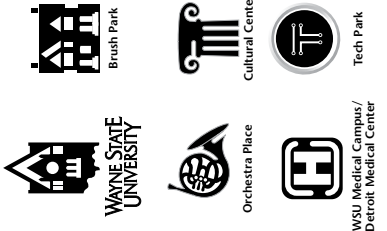

# PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION GUIDE

## TYPES OF PARKING

### Assigned parking

Employees, students and residents of university housing are eligible for assigned parking. Assigned parking is on a paid basis, either by payroll deduction or cash in advance.

The assigned parking permit does not guarantee the holder a reserved space, but only an opportunity to park within a specified area. Entry to assigned parking structures and lots is by OneCard only.

### General parking

Students and employees who do not join the assigned parking program may park in general parking areas (see map) using their WSU OneCard or with cash. Most general parking lots are gate controlled and operate on a paid entry and free exit basis.

### Guest parking

Visitors should bring quarters or dollar bills to park in any one of Wayne State's parking structures or lots. Guest parking prices vary and are posted. You may purchase a guest card from a Cash System Value Terminal (CSVT). Guest cards can be used for future parking needs by loading more money onto the card utilizing a CSVT.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

### CSVT Locations

In order to access the OneCard-only structures and lots, students and employees must put money on to their OneCard. You can do this either online via [pipeline.wayne.edu](http://pipeline.wayne.edu) or by using a Cash System Value Terminal (CSVT) located in 16 different areas of campus. ### Do Your Part to Pick-up

Keep Wayne State parking facilities clean. Remember to throw your trash into any number of receptacles located throughout the parking facilities and at most facility entrances and exits.

## PARKING RULES

### Parking hours and regulations

Parking regulations are in effect throughout the year. Review signage at the parking location to determine hours. Saturday and Sunday parking is available in Parking Structures 2 and 8; Saturday parking is also available in Parking Structure 6. Refer to [parking.wayne.edu](http://parking.wayne.edu) for hours.

### Parking violations

Parking tickets issued by the WSU Police Department on university property are eligible for a discount rate if paid within 15 days of issuance. Payments can be made by mail (enclose the ticket with payment) or in person at the Office of Parking and Transportation Services.

## PARKING HELP

### Parking for people with disabilities

Assigned parking is available for students with disabilities. For more information, contact Educational Accessibility Services (EAS) at (313) 577-1851, TTY (313) 577-3365 or visit 1600 Undergraduate Library.

### Parking assistance

Contact the Office of Parking and Transportation Services Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. at (313) 577-1979 for car-related assistance for problems such as a dead battery or if your keys are locked in your car.

### Emergency assistance

In case of emergency, contact the Wayne State Police Department at (313) 577-2222 or 7-2222 from a WSU blue-light phone.

### Shuttle service on campus

A complimentary parking shuttle service is available in 15-minute intervals on the main campus during the fall and winter semesters. The medical campus shuttle is available in 30-minute intervals year-round. WSU OneCards must be shown to the driver upon request. Visit [parking.wayne.edu](http://parking.wayne.edu) for hours.

### Public transportation

Transit can be an inexpensive and low-stress way to travel.
